ENROLLMENT FEES

Application Fee – for new students who wish to apply to MA \$25

Re-Enrollment Fee – for returning students to complete online. \$15-50

Deadlines are: March = \$15, April = \$25, May and thereafter = \$50

Entrance Fee – This annual fee, due at registration, includes student \$500

insurance, yearbook, campus ministries, student association, standardized testing, and class dues. It is non-refundable after the first ten days of school.

DISCOUNTS

A Multi-Student Discount is shown on the tuition chart above.

An Early-Bird Discount of \$50 will be applied when the Entrance Fee is paid in full by June 30. Credit for summer work on campus does not qualify.

A Pre-Payment Discount of 5% is available when a full semester or year is paid in advance.

8TH GRADE GPA SCHOLARSHIPS

GPA Scholarships are based on a student's GPA from the 8th grade and are shown on the December statement of the freshmen year.

TUITION ASSISTANCE

Church Tuition Assistance - Some churches provide tuition assistance to eligible members. Please contact your church pastor or treasurer for further information.

Work-Matching Tuition Assistance and MA Heritage Grant - Madison Academy has limited resources available for qualifying families based on need. Applications for both funds are available in the Business Office.

WORK EXPERIENCE

A typical student can earn \$1500 in the summer and \$200/ month working on campus or the MA Linen Services. The employee must be 14 years of age and enrolled. Wages are credited to the student's account and can be seen on the monthly statement. Note that student activities can interrupt work schedules and therefore affect payroll.

SCHOOL UNIFORMS / DRESS CODE

Madison Academy has chosen Educational Outfitters, 3205 Powell Avenue, Suite B, Nashville, TN 37204 (ph: 615.373.0433, web: educationaloutfitters.com) as the sole source for school apparel for both the regular school day and PE/Fitness/ Acros courses. Clothing may be purchased at the local store or online. See the 2016-17 Dress Code for the complete policy.

FINANCIAL POLICIES

Registration Process - Registration is not complete until the first month's tuition and the entrance fee have been paid.

Billing Procedures – For your convenience, the annual tuition charge is divided into ten installments and billed August through May. The monthly installment plan is designed to help parents spread the cost of tuition over ten months and does not signify the cost of education per month. No refunds will be made for a partial month upon a student's withdrawal. A monthly statement will be mailed or emailed to the responsible party on the first day of the month.

Tuition and any applied fees are due on the 15th of each month. A late fee of \$25 per student will be charged and any discounts and/or tuition assistance matching funds will be forfeited if payment is not made by the end of each month. A history of checks returned for insufficient funds may result in a request that payments be made in cash or money order.

Delinquent Accounts - No account will be allowed to be more than sixty days past due. The student will be placed on economic suspension if the account is not cleared. Students with past due accounts may not be allowed to take exams and will not receive transcripts. Participation in extracurricular activities involving additional costs may be curtailed until the account is paid in full or satisfactory arrangements made. Seniors will not be allowed to take final exams, or receive a diploma or transcript unless the account is paid in full. Any exceptions to this policy must be approved by the Finance Committee or its designee.
