## PK-12 REFERRAL PROGRAM

Tuition does not cover the full cost of operating Madison Academy's comprehensive program. **The cost of educating young people is DOUBLE the tuition charged.** Members of the Seventh-day Adventist Church support Adventist education with substantial church and conference subsidies. We pass that savings on to our students regardless of religious affiliation.

<b>Continuous Enrollment Fee</b> – applied to each students' account on March 1, unless withdraw communicated in writing.	\$25
<b>PK-8<sup>th</sup> Entrance Fee</b> *^ – This annual fee, due at registration, includes student accident insurance, standardized testing, yearbook, and textbooks.	\$300
<b>High School Entrance Fee</b> *^ – This annual fee, due at registration, includes student accident insurance, standardized testing, college-career services, library, FACTS/RW access, Chromebook lease, yearbook, campus ministries, student council, and class dues.	\$525

Accounts must be current with <b>no past due balance</b> in order to receive these discounts:

TUITION ASSISTANCE

**Partnering for Eternity** – This scholarship program offers a unique opportunity for student in grades K-12 to develop relationships with mentors. See the business office for application.

**Tuition Assistance** – We are committed to partnering with serious, dedicated families using available funds that come from a variety of individuals and foundations. For students in grades K-12 participation in the PFE Program is required in order to qualify for assistance. For high schoolers, all assistance is a “match” to the student’s paycheck and contingent on the family’s monthly payment. Needs-based financial assistance is awarded annually. See the business office or website for an application and deadline.

**Church Assistance** – Some churches provide tuition assistance to eligible members. Contact your church pastor or treasurer for information.

**High School Work Experience** – A typical student earns *an average* of \$120/month working on campus. The employee must be 14 years of age and enrolled. Note that activities can interrupt work schedules, and therefore affect payroll and the work-match funds awarded. **Any difference is the families’ responsibility** to pay.

FINANCIAL POLICIES

**Registration Process** – Registration is not complete until the first month’s tuition and the entrance fee have been paid in full.

**Billing Procedures** – For your convenience, the annual tuition charge is divided into ten installments and billed August through May. The monthly installment plan is designed to help parents spread the cost of tuition over ten months and does not signify the cost of education per month. No refunds will be made for a partial month upon a student’s withdrawal. A monthly statement will be mailed or emailed to the responsible party by the 5th day of the month.

**Tuition and any applied fees are due on the 15<sup>th</sup> of each month. A late fee of \$25 per student may be charged and any discounts, tuition assistance and/or work-matching funds will be forfeited if payment is not made by the end of each month.**

**Delinquent Accounts** – Policies include the following:

- Students with past due accounts will not be allowed to take exams.
- Student records will be held until the full student account is paid in full.
- Participation in extracurricular activities involving additional costs may be forfeited until the account is paid in full or satisfactory arrangements have been made.
- Students with accounts 60 days past due will be asked to withdraw until the account is current.
- Seniors will not be allowed to take final exams, or receive a diploma or transcript unless the account is paid in full.
- Siblings of graduates must not have a past due balance.
- Accounts must be paid in full for the student to enter school the following year.
- The Finance Advisory or its designee must approve any exceptions to this policy.
